Appreciation of Copernicus as tradition

- Taught in Cracow, read, translated
- Portraits and poems since 16th c.
- Historiographies since 16th/17th c.
- Epitaph in 1580, monuments since 19th c.
- Medals since 18th/19th c.
- Since 19th c. "kopernikologia"
- Societies and museums since 19th c.







Copernicus – still a Polish astronomer but more European

- Planetarium renamed after Copernicus (e.g. Chorzów)
- In Austrian Servus TV, the programme "Copernicus Mysteries of the Galaxy"
- Biographia Copernicana project at LMU Munich (edition of the complete works)
- German government-funded project "Kopernikus" for climate-friendly solutions
- EU-funded Copernicus Climate Change Service (C3S)

- Copernicus is an essential figure on Polish stamps and money
- Copernicus is used strategically in the representation of Poland
- Copernicus, as Polish ambassador of science, should reach everyone
- Stamps and currency with Copernicus refers to other media (e.g. paintings, monuments, buildings)
- Copernicus is shown as a Renaissance scholar, astronomer and genius
- On stamps and currency, the astronomical works and thesis of Copernicus prevail
- established iconography from the 16th-19th c. is used (half portrait, astrolabe, models of heliocentrism)
- Commemoration of Copernicus is dynamic to be continued...?
